A spacious yet intimate exhibition space comprised of two rooms, the gallery contains architectural structures and remnants of the original Firehouse #1 Engine Bay. Within the Firehouse Arts Center, there are two additional exhibition spaces within the foyer and second floor dedicated to the solo exhibitions of Bay Area artists and Pleasanton Art League members.
